COUSTEAU ET FOSTER



THE NATIONAL TRUST




THE NATIONAL TRUST for the Cayman Islands is a non-profit organisation dedicated to conserving the natural environments, protecting native wildlife, and preserving historic sites for present and future generations. Among its many achievements is the recovery of the endemic Grand Cayman *Blue Iguana*—a species once teetering on the edge of extinction. In the early 2000s, fewer than 30 remained in the wild. Through years of scientific research, habitat protection, and community commitment, the population has rebounded, with more than 1,200 Blue Iguanas now released into their natural habitat within dedicated protected areas, marking one of the world's greatest species recovery success stories. Yet, the work is far from over. Continued support is vital to ensure that the Blue Iguana, and the natural heritage it represents, are protected forever.





THE BLUE IGUANA

Blu Lagartos celebrates the aesthetic beauty of the Cayman Islands' *Blue Iguana*. Its skin, scales, spiky spine, and vivid gradient colors—from deep blue to turquoise to teal—create a mesmerizing effect. The texture of these 'Blue Dragons,' for which they are affectionately known, is paradoxically rough yet soft: a dorsal crest carries a bold edge, while the belly and legs offer a more smooth, supple surface; its skin—remarkably flexible, yielding gracefully. Scales vary in shape from diamond and triangle to oval and octagon—forming an intricate, interlocking pattern. Blu Lagartos draws inspiration directly from these distinctive elements: colors, textures, and geometric designs.




VERBESINA CAYMANENSIS

Leaf designs inspired by the critically endangered flowering shrub, also known as *Sybil's Crownbeard*, endemic to Cayman Brac, and protected by the Cayman Islands National Conservation Law



MYRMECOPHILA THOMSONIANA



Drawing inspiration from the Cayman Islands' national flower, *Myrmecophila thomsoniana*—also known as the 'Wild Banana Orchid'—this elongated petal earring design accented with diamonds captures the flower's delicate essence in an undulated silhouette. This cherished and protected endemic botanical holds profound Caymanian symbolism: resilience, thriving in the islands' rugged coastal terrains; love and fidelity, its single, steadfast bloom evoking deep-rooted devotion cherished in island lore; and uniqueness, as a rare species found nowhere else on earth, mirroring the Cayman Islands' one-of-a-kind natural heritage.
